Our members held a successful 1st annual Monte Carlo Night, a beautiful 31st annual Housewalk, and sold mums, poinsettias and spring plants. The Junior Volunteers group was born and mentored through their first fundraiser, the Family Fitness Walk. Our family aid team was utilized to meet immediate, short-term needs of families and children referred to us from local agencies or school social workers.

A Glenbard West and Glenbard South student were awarded our GEIW scholarship for the credits needed to earn an Associates Degree from College of DuPage! Our scholarship advisory team stays connected with them through their time at C.O.D. to optimize their opportunity for success!
